

## Clean HEET Program



APPLICANTS – PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOUR CONTRACTOR(S) TO ENSURE THEY ARE ABLE TO MEET ALL REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO HIRING THEM

The Clean Heating Efficiently with Electric Technology, or **Clean HEET** incentive program, was developed by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District to encourage homeowners to replace qualifying wood-burning devices with electric heat pumps to help reduce wood smoke pollution and improve air quality.

All removal, decommissioning, and installation work must be performed by a contractor who is licensed with the State of California. Use this website to find a licensed contractor: <a href="Consumer - CSLB">Consumer - CSLB</a> (ca.gov)

All projects require a licensed contractor with a minimum of a *C-20 Warm-Air Heating, Ventilating, and Air-Conditioning Contractor* license for heat pump installation. Additional licenses may be required depending on the type of work being performed, and more than one contractor may be needed per project.

## **CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS**

Contractors must provide property owner with a quote for the project work in advance of project approval.

Contractors must provide property owner with a receipt showing a zero balance upon payment.

Contractors decommissioning a freestanding wood stove must render the device permanently unable to burn wood (for example, creating a hole in the firebox) and must dispose of the device at a licensed dismantler/recycling facility. A copy of the scrappage or disposal receipt confirming destruction of the device is required.

For projects involving a wood-burning insert a fireplace, contractors must also permanently decommission the fireplace by either removing the fireplace structure or permanently sealing it (such as closing it off with drywall or filling it with masonry.) *Temporary measures, such as a balloon insert, a fireplace plug, or a chimney cover are insufficient.* 

Contractors must fill out and sign a <u>Contractor Certification Form</u> after work is completed to provide the following information:

- Contractor business information, including CA contractor license number
- Confirmation of property where work was performed
- Brief description of work performed
- For contractors installing a heat pump,
  - description of heat pump installed
- For contractors decommissioning/disposing of existing wood-burning device,
  - description of wood-burning device removed
  - o description of method used to render device permanently inoperable
  - if applicable, description of method used to render fireplace permanently inoperable,
    if for a wood-burning fireplace insert replacement project
  - o name of dismantler/recycling facility where device has been disposed of
- Contractor's signature attestation that the form has been accurately filled out
